Opportunities to Serve

Bereavement Committee

The responsibilities of the Bereavement Committee are to: provide peer support by encouraging collaboration among bereavement professionals through education, utilization of community resources, promoting a greater awareness of quality bereavement programs in our member agencies, and fostering understanding of the critical role played by bereavement professionals in our state hospice programs.

Education Committee

The responsibilities of the Education Committee are to: plan, organize and evaluate the Annual Meeting, Education Workshops held every other month, and other special events for the purpose of meeting the interdisciplinary educational needs of the membership of UHPCO.

Ethics Committee

The responsibilities of the Ethics Committee are to: provide a forum to explore ethical dilemmas, facilitate communication, and provide education related to ethical issues and standards of end of life care.

Governmental Affairs

The responsibilities of the Governmental Affairs Committee are: to monitor State and national legislative and regulatory issues that may directly or indirectly affect the hospice and palliative care industry; and keep UHPCO members informed regarding any such issues.

Membership/Nominating/Awards Committee

The responsibilities of the Membership Committee are to: keep an updated list of UHPCO members; recruit new members to join UHPCO annually; and other duties as described in Article III of the Bylaws. The responsibilities of the Nominating Committee are to: mail out a written call for nominations to all UHPCO members at least three (3) months prior to an election; nominate at least one (1) eligible person for each office for an election; and facilitate the election of new officers as described in Article IV, Section 5 of the Bylaws. The responsibilities of the Awards Committee are to: ensure that a written call for nominations is sent to all UHPCO members, select recipients to receive the Hospice Hero Awards and candidates for the Burns Magleby Scholarship. These are to be given at the Annual Convention or Holiday Luncheon.

Public Relations

The responsibilities of the Public Relations Committee are to: write and distribute a newsletter (at least quarterly) to UHPCO members; and promote a positive image of hospice throughout the State of Utah through an ongoing program of public awareness, information and resource exchange.

Volunteer Committee

The responsibilities of the Volunteer Committee are to: assist in the planning and staffing of the Annual convention and other special events sponsored by UHPCO; assist in the development of volunteer training programs for UHPCO members.
